Office location will be determined based on operational needs at the time of offer. Potential office locations within the SDA are New Westminster, Maple Ridge, Port Moody, Coquitlam, Port Coquitlam, Burnaby and Pitt Meadows. Applicants who do not fully meet the required qualifications may be considered for this position, but at a lower classification.

As an Aboriginal Clinician, Child and Youth Mental Health, you provide direct clinical services such as intake, assessment, diagnosis, treatment, and crisis intervention for children, youth and their families. Consulting with community agencies, schools, hospitals, and other ministry programs, you understand the importance of being involved in community education, development, coordination and prevention/early intervention programs. You build and maintain relationships with a wide variety of stakeholders in the community to ensure that conflicts are resolved and appropriate outcomes are achieved.

Qualifications for this role include:

- MSW (Clinical Specialization), M.ED or MA in Counselling or Clinical Psychology, M.A. in Child & Youth Care.
 - Candidates within six months of completing their Master's Degree may be considered at a lower classification until the completion of their degree.
- Clinical experience working with children and youth presenting with moderate to severe mental health conditions, with responsibility for providing a wide range of community based mental health service.
- Preference may be given to candidates with 1 or more years of experience.
- Preference may be given to candidates who have:
 - Recent experience (within the past 3 years) working with Aboriginal people and communities.
 - Experience providing services utilizing an outreach model.
 - Experience working with supporting and counselling parents and families whose children are struggling with moderate to severe mental health conditions.
 - One year of full-time post Master Degree experience providing child & youth counselling services.
 - Indigenous heritage (First Nations, Metis or Inuit) with the required combination of education and experience.
