# COVID-19 Emergency Funding Available Now!

To support emerging needs and priorities during this emergency period, the IELCC Terms and Conditions of the Government of Canada have temporarily extended eligible spending to encompass activities that provide assistance to Indigenous children and families impacted by the CO-VID-19 pandemic.

First Nations and Urban IELCC Programs and Services (Aboriginal Friendship Centres, Head Start Programs, Aboriginal Infant Development, Aboriginal Supported Child Development, Aboriginal Child Care, etc.) can apply for one-time funding to support children birth to six years of age and their families during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Recipients can receive up to \$10,000 in funding for the period of June 1, 2020 – September 30, 2020.




BCACCS is highlighting resources that you and your program can use to celebrate the importance of fatherhood and family.

# Working Together to Create Strategies for Well-Being During Covid-19

Children & teachers are dealing with feelings of anxiety, uncertainty, and stress during the current pandemic.

The need for social distancing has taken us away from our communities of practice and from opportunities to create solutions together. This workshop will share some current research on the impacts of stress in young children to explore habits that enhance well-being.

The hope of this workshop is to enable ECE's to dialogue and apply their wealth of experience. Using Group discussions along with the Early Learning Framework of BC, we will all together create strategies to foster wellbeing for children and educators.
