Working Together



Communities everywhere have been working together to support each other through the CO-VID-19 crisis. This week are so fortunate to be able to bring you another inspiring story. This time from Laxgalts'ap, BC.

Liza Haldane, Program Administrator, shared what she, her Manager, Wanda Stevens, and colleague, Lavita Tait at the Ksi Xy'ans Daycare Head Start have been doing to support children and families.

They began a "Teach My Preschooler" program mid-April. Each week, families receive a learning kit with various materials and resources to support each week's topic of discovery! Each week is theme based. The first week was dedicated to Social and Emotional Wellness and included a COVID-19 resource kit. The weekly kits are filled with songs, hands on fun activities, a book, and an information page with a cheat sheet on how to support their child with each particular theme.

To keep children physically active and support the holistic development of possible vulnerable children, "Playground by Appointment" was created! The program was launched during the same week as the Physical Activity Learning Resource kit. The Ksi Xy'ans Daycare Head Start recognizes physical activity as being critical for optimal brain development, especially for young children. Playground by Appointment aims to support not only the physical, but the mental health and well-being for children and their caregivers during this uncertain time. Families from the same household with children ages zero to 5 years old can book a 30-minute time slot to use the preschool playground. Play times are limited to 30 minutes to ensure there is enough time for staff to wipe any necessary equipment and be ready for the next family.

Liza and her team have been very busy supporting families and finding creative ways to engage. We thank them for being such an inspiration.

Funding Assistance for the Fall 2020 Semester

Indigenous early childhood education students are encouraged to apply now!

Please see the information below for more about eligibility criteria.

The BC Aboriginal Child Care Society (BCACCS) is sharing information about the Education Support Fund on behalf of the Early Childhood Educators of BC (ECEBC).

Please note that applications from students who self-identify as Indigenous will be prioritized.

The Early Childhood Educators of British Columbia and the B.C. Ministry of Children and Family Development are delighted to announce that the Education Support Fund are accepting applications once again for bursary funding.

Funding assistance for the Fall 2020 semester is made possible through the Canada-British Columbia Early Learning and Child Care Agreement, a partnership between the Province of B.C. and the Government of Canada.

Eligible applicants can continue to apply for one of two streams:

- Student Bursary: up to \$500 per course, to a maximum of 8 courses, for a total of \$4,000 per semester to assist with tuition and living expenses while studying
- Workforce Development Bursary: up to \$5,000 per semester to assist with tuition and other expenses such as loss of wages or travel. This funding will support ECEs, ECE Assistants, Responsible Adults (as defined in the Child Care Licensing Regulation) and StrongStart BC Facilitators who are currently working in the ECE field and would like to upgrade their credentials.

The amount of bursary funding available per semester will be limited in order to ensure that funding is available for the full academic year. As a result, not all students who apply will receive funding. Bursaries for the 2020/21 academic year will prioritize the following students:

- Students who self-identify as Indigenous.
- Students completing their final requirements for certification and/or upgrading their credentials to include their Infant Toddler and/or Special Needs Educator qualifications.

Bursary applications will be open from December 9, 2020 at 7:00am to December 24, 2020 at 4:00pm.
