As an Indigenous Mental Health Outreach Worker, you provide specialized mental health assessment and treatment services to Indigenous children, youth and their families. Specialized services also include community development, consultation, co-ordination, education and contract management in regard to child and youth mental health.

Under the direct clinical supervision of a Mental Health Team Leader and as appropriate, the clinical direction of a qualified CYMH clinician, works as a member of a multi-disciplinary Mental Health Team in a number of communities.

This is your opportunity to work with families facing difficult challenges and help make a difference.

- Diploma in Nursing or Psychiatric Nursing plus 2 years of relevant experience
- Experience providing child & youth mental health services
- Experience providing outreach services
- Experience facilitating groups for adolescents

Preferences may be given to applicants who:

- Self-identify as First Nations, Métis, or Inuit with the required combination of education and experience.
- Have extensive experience with Indigenous communities.
