Flexible work options are available; this position may be able to work up to two (2) days at home per week subject to an approved teleworking agreement.

There are four (4) positions available: One (1) position in Fort St John, two (2) positions in Dawson Creek and one (1) position in Chetwynd. Applicants who do not fully meet the required qualifications may be considered for this position, but at a lower classification.

An integral member of a multi-disciplinary Community Mental Health Team and in coordination with other community agencies and professionals, you provide a range of mental health services to children, youth and their families, when the child or youth is suffering from serious emotional, psychological, behavioral or psychiatric illness.

As a clinician, you provide direct clinical services such as intake, assessment, diagnosis, treatment, and crisis intervention for children, youth and their families. Consulting with community agencies, schools, hospitals, and other ministry programs, you understand the importance of being involved in community education, development, coordination and prevention/early intervention programs.

Qualifications for this role include:

- Master's in social work, educational counselling, clinical psychology or child and youth care or comparable graduate degree at the master's level, or equivalent.
- Minimum of one year full-time equivalent experience working with children and youth and their families, with responsibility for providing a wide range of community based mental health services.
- Must possess and maintain a valid class 5 BC driver's license with no restriction or equivalent (i.e. from another Canadian Province).

Preference may be given to applicants with the following:

- Two years or more experience working with children and youth and their families, with responsibility for providing a wide range of community based mental health services.
- Applicants who self-identify as First Nations, Métis or Inuit with the required combination of education and experience.
