The Child and Youth Mental Health Program provides specialized mental health assessment and treatment services to children, youth and their families when the child or youth is suffering serious emotional, psychological or behavioral disorders.

The Indigenous Mental Health outreach worker is responsible for providing a range of mental health services to Indigenous youth, families and communities. The foundation of the work is forming positive, respectful relationships with community members, community-based service providers, various mental health service providers and other professionals.

- BSW, BA (psychology), bachelor's degree or higher in child and youth care, registered nurse, registered psychiatric nurse or comparable degree at bachelor's level, **OR**
- Diploma in a related field (i.e. nursing, psychiatric nursing or other) plus two (2) years of *relevant experience.

*Relevant experience must include a combination of the following:

- Experience providing child & youth mental health services.
- Experience providing outreach services.
- Experience facilitating groups for adolescents.

Preferences may be given to applicants who:

- Self-identify as First Nations, Métis or Inuit with the required combination of education and experience.
- Have experience with Indigenous communities.
