The Métis Family Connections Navigator assists the Early Years Manager to deliver all aspects of the program and services to the Lower Mainland. DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Conducts community outreach with children (birth to 8 years old) and their families, and record the information in order to assess the immediate and long-term needs of the families
- Enrolls Métis families into the MNBC Métis Family Connections, resource and referral program
- Refers families to professionals, programs, agencies, and services within their community
- Distributes Métis Family Connections materials and information to families
- Documents barriers for Métis families in accessing Early Years programs and services and advocates on their behalf to resolve the barriers
- Plans and coordinates meetings and events, as required
- Attends Métis Chartered Communities and stakeholder meetings, as required
- Carries out various administrative tasks, as assigned
- Reports activities to the Early Years Manager, as required
- Participates in committees and project teams as required.
- Undertakes related duties as assigned, consistent with the job grade of the position.
- Other duties may be assigned as needed to ensure the efficient operation of MNBC.
- Regular/ occasional attendance at meetings/ events that may require work and travel outside of normal business hours.

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QUALIFICATIONS

- Diploma in Early Childhood Education, Community Support Work, K-3 Education or a related field from a recognized, post-secondary institution.
- Minimum of four (4) years' experience in the early years' field or public-school system.
- Previous education and/or experience working with children (birth to 8 years) and families.
- A combination of relevant experience, education, and training may be considered.
- Demonstrated ability to effectively communicate both verbally and in writing.
- Ability to lead, problem solve, and utilize team-building skills.
- Proven ability to utilize strong interpersonal skills to deal with others effectively.
- Proven ability to prioritize tasks, meet deadlines, and work with minimal supervision.
- Proven ability to utilize, adapt and embrace new technologies, including Word, Excel and other database/software required by the role.
- Knowledge and/or awareness of the historical and contemporary contributions made by Métis people in B.C.
- Possession of, or the ability to obtain, a Class 5 driver's licence may be required.
- The position may require the completion of a Criminal Record Check and Vulnerable Sector Check.
